

WHAT IS HAPPENING TO THE WORLD?

We all sympathize with the thousands of people who are affected by storms, floods, and other natural disasters. We understand that these natural occurrences are part of the world we live in. They are often called “Acts of God.” Then we watch in horror as hundreds of innocent people are gunned down by a very disturbed individual who, for whatever reason decided to terrorize a peaceful concert. And all we can do is ask, “Why? Perhaps the following may shed some light on the “Why?” In 1854 the McGuffey’s Eclectic Reader taught, warned and predicted...

If you can induce a community to doubt the authenticity of the Scriptures; to question the obligations of faith; to be undecided, whether there be any such thing as virtue or vice; whether there be an eternal state of reckoning beyond the grave; or whether there be any such being as God; you have broken down the barriers of moral virtue, and hoisted the flood gates of immorality and crime. I need not say that when a people have once done this, they can no longer exist as a tranquil and happy people. Every bond that holds society together would be ruptured; fraud and treachery would take the place of confidence between man and man; the tribunals would be scenes of bribery and injustice; materialism, perjury, ambition, and revenge would walk through the land, and render it more like the dwelling of savage beasts than the tranquil abode of civilized and Christianized men.

Is the answer to the crime and moral problem so simple that our highly educated and sophisticated society either cannot, or will not, see it? It is time we as a civilized society start identifying the disease instead of just talking about the symptoms.

We will never cure the problem of out of control crime, and immorality until we put God back in people’s hearts and lives and stand firm on His Holy Word. But it must begin with those of us who claim to be God’s people. You see, we are either contributing to the problem by apathy, neglect and compromise, or we are helping to solve it by faithfulness to God and His Word.

Sermon Summaries

Speaker: Dennis Baker

AM: Shepherding: A Model for the Home – John 10:1-10
Shepherding is usually defined in terms of church leadership. The Shepherd (pastor/elder) is charged to lead the flock (church). A closer look reveals that effective leadership in the home is a pre-requisite for leadership in the Family of God (see 1 Timothy 3:4-5). Anyone who leads should consider the 4 principles of biblical shepherding: knowing, leading, protecting and providing.

PM: We Could Use A Good Prophet Today - Malachi 1:1-5
Malachi is the last of the old testament prophets. While the gift of prophecy was active in the early church, today it seems the prophetic voice is silent. We could use someone like Malachi, to tell us straight what the problems are and how to correct them, but would we listen?
