
Great Assets of our Faith – A Great Commitment – Matthew 11:25-30

"Oh, what peace we often forfeit, what needless pain we bear." These words by Joseph Scriven are in a familiar song, "What A Friend We have In Jesus." This song may have been inspired by Matthew 11. Jesus observes the struggles that people have. Some of these are self-inflicted because the people have rejected God. Even when He has given great evidence of His activity, people still ignore and live according to their own desires. Jesus has made a great commitment to you. Can you commit to Him?

The Birth of Samson - Judges 13

The more I study about the life of Samson, the more I'm convinced that Samson gets thrown under the bus in our Bible classes. His calling as a Nazarite - for life - was important in how God was able to use him to liberate Israel. Come back tonight, and we will geek out on the nuances of the Nazarite vow together.



I read an article the other day that really caught my attention. The article presented a perspective about the new life that we may forget. ***“When we become a Christian we really do receive a brand-new life from God! Then we face a startling reality: We have a Brand-New Life, but we still live in the Same Old World!”***

Our view of sin may change, and what we know about Jesus may change. The world, however, continues unchanged. The same selfish attitudes and destructive habits define the people around us. The difference is you now are standing on the outside looking in, and perhaps even an advocate for a better way to live. This makes you a threat to the world system. This makes you a target.

The people Peter writes about have a similar circumstance. They have been called out of the world and have faced various trials because of it. Often times, when you make a decision and then get flack for that decision, you tend to second guess it. In the case of these new Christians, Peter knew they were struggling with second guessing. The heart of his encouragement is the statement in 1 Peter 1:6-7 ***“You rejoice in this, though now for a short time you have had to struggle in various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith—more valuable than gold, which perishes though refined by fire—may result in praise, glory, and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.”***

The events that we may define as faith challenging are really events that are strengthening our faith. The difference is our ability to keep our eyes on the goal, our faith...the salvation of our souls.

These past few weeks have been challenging for many, and we might think we can't take any more. It is those times when we focus intently on the goal of our faith. Peter can give us this advice because he has been through the fire himself. From the time Peter began to follow to the end of his life, following Jesus meant trials, change, finding his way to a new place, and then repeating the cycle. Each time, the new place he found himself in took him closer to the goal. He was able to endure because, he had this conviction and prayer for us; ***“Now the God of all grace, who called you to His eternal glory in Christ Jesus, will personally restore, establish, strengthen, and support you after you have suffered a little.”***

These words inspire us to hold on to the *brand-new life* as we live in the *same old world!* -Dennis
