

My friend asked me, "What happens to people after they die?" I hope my answer was adequate. You are walking on holy ground when you enter that type of discussion with people. When society in general asks that question, they might find four answers:

1. Nothing – We will decay and/or disintegrate. Death is a dead end. Only a memory survives.
2. Ghosts – Phantoms of what we once were. Like a morning mist. Specters.
3. Or, hawks. Or, cows, or a mechanic in Kokomo. Reincarnation rewards or punishes accordingly.
4. We return to the cosmic consciousness of the universe. Absorbed like a lake absorbs a storm.

My answer came from the narrative in Luke 16:19-31. This is the account of Lazarus and the rich man. Both of them die and go to separate places. But they both have awareness and can perceive their surroundings. This tells me there is a part of us that lives on. It is the soul of a person. It contains our spirit and mind. It is the part of us that recognizes self and the fact that we are alive. It is the life principle.

When we die, our body is separated from that soul. What happened to Jesus will happen to us. We will breathe our last and give up our Spirit (Matthew 27:50). His body was put in a tomb. But on the third day, "There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow. The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men. The angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay.'" (Matthew 28:2-6) The life principle of Jesus was reunited with a glorified body. ***"His resurrection body bore a semblance to the crucified one; but only a semblance. Jesus' disciples, who lived with him for three years, didn't recognize him at first. Mary Magdalene (John 20:11-18), the Emmaus disciples (Luke 24:13-35), and the twelve (John 21:1-7), saw Jesus but didn't see him as Jesus. He did familiar physical things such as walking and eating. He did things he had done, but appeared in a different form. If I were to look at photos of you as an infant, I would experience the same phenomena. Perhaps, upon study, I would spot a common trait: the shape of your mouth or angle of your eyes. But finding common traits would require focus. You've changed!"*** (excerpt from Max Lacado, "What Happens When You Die?")


CJ needs a list of graduating seniors. If you are a senior, or the parent of a graduating seniors, please let him know soon.
