FROM JOS, NIGERIA

Greetings to you all in the precious name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. On behalf of myself and my family, I say happy New Year to you all. One interesting thing is that time is with man, and it only counts while we are here in the flesh. When we wear immortality, month and years will all be gone. Therefore, it is important that we do what will count at the end for righteousness while in the flesh. It will not make any sense to spend the fleeting moment on earth in a way that will place us in eternal state of rejection by God. In view of this, we pray that the grace that God gave us through the year 2023, be available unto us even in an increased measure. May we learn to say all of God and none of us. May He use us mightily this year.

Permit me to use this opportunity to appreciate all of you who stood by us last year in preaching the Gospel of Christ in Africa. May God bless you in his special way. Thank you also for your constant prayers. I believe strongly that if not for God's intervention, we would not have survived to this point.

God spared us from all the violent crisis that happened in Plateau State last year. The recent one is the attack by the Islamic militants on the eve of Christmas, which left over 190 people dead and over 400 people rendered homeless. Initially, the figure for those who

died was about 50, but those who sustained various degrees of injuries could not make it as days passed by. The number of the victims continues to rise. Some are still receiving treat-

ment in the hospital. While people were preparing for the celebration of Christmas, the evil people struck, killing many people, burning houses. Farm produce was burnt by the at-





tackers, leaving many people hungry. Please, do remember these people in prayers. We pray this year will be better in terms of security and opportunities for us to preach the Gospel of peace to those who need salvation.

Looking back at the year 2023, I discover that some of the things I planned to do were not done. The failure was not on God's part, but on my part. I pray I overcome those lapses this year. I thank God because in part of last year, we were able to establish a new congregation in a virgin land in Plateau State. This congregation is located in the area of the government seat. It is important that the government also know that there is one true church. This would not be possible if we continued to stay at the outskirt of the town. But this decision is not without great pain, because getting a place to meet has been a challenge. We secured a temporary place of meeting. We pray by this year, God should provide us with a meeting place, no matter how small it may be, so that we can also organize classes for children who come around.

The congregation at Foron Mission is standing strong, even in the midst of persecution and adversity. Same with the congregation at Mazah Road. We pray we will have more opportunity to work with these congregations for them to remain standing for Jesus this year. Still recounting God's faithfulness, we will not fail to thank God for his mercies upon the congregation at Toro, Bauchi State. This congregation had its building damaged by windstorm. The interesting thing is that the damage took place in the night, not during the hours of fellowship. Hence, it was only the building that was destroyed. Glory be to God that we have replaced the roof and made the building better than before. On a sad note, we lost one of the faithful sisters of the congregation due to sickness. The good side is that she died as a faithful Christian. Her life remains an encouragement to many people both within the congregation and outside. I believe nothing happens without God having his good plans about us. May we understand his will for us this year 2024, and learn to walk closely with Jesus this year than ever before. Once again, happy 2024 and thank you for helping us even in most difficult financial situation that confronts you. This sacrifices you make will not go in vain I believe.
