

Blaspheming the Holy Spirit

²²Then they brought him a demon-possessed man who was blind and mute, and Jesus healed him, so that he could both talk and see. ²³All the people were astonished and said, "Could this be the Son of David?" ²⁴ But when the Pharisees heard this, they said, "It is only by Beelzebul, the prince of demons, that this fellow drives out demons." ²⁵Jesus knew their thoughts and said to them, "Every kingdom divided against itself will be ruined, and every city or household divided against itself will not stand. ²⁶ If Satan drives out Satan, he is divided against himself. How then can his kingdom stand? ²⁷And if I drive out demons by Beelzebul, by whom do your people drive them out? So then, they will be your judges. ²⁸ But if it is by the Spirit of God that I drive out demons, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. ²⁹ "Or again, how can anyone enter a strong man's house and carry off his possessions unless he first ties up the strong man? Then he can plunder his house. ³⁰ "Whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters. ³¹ And so I tell



you, every kind of sin and slander can be forgiven, but blasphemy against the Spirit will not be forgiven. ³² Anyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven, but anyone who speaks against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven, either in this age or in the age to come. ³³ "Make a tree good and its fruit will be good, or make a tree bad and its fruit will be bad, for a tree is recognized by its fruit. ³⁴ You brood of vipers, how can you who are evil say anything good? For the mouth speaks what the heart is full of. ³⁵ A good man brings good things out of the good stored up in him, and an evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in him. ³⁶ But I tell you that everyone will have to give account on the day of judgment for every empty word they have spoken. ³⁷ For by your words you will be condemned." "The Story of the Old Testament" class at Lakeview Church of Christ on Wednesday nights, 6-9 pm Jan 29-April 30. Teacher: Dr. Mark McLean (Silverdale, WA)

Class Description - This course is a three-credit hour survey of the Old Testament. Special attention will be given to the flow of God's interaction with the nation of Israel through the Old Testament era. Appropriate historical and cultural backgrounds will be addressed when introducing the thirty-nine books of the Old Testament canon. Major theological doctrines and high-profile characters of the Old Testament will be studied within their historical context.

Mature high school juniors and seniors may take the class for credit. Credit students will be expected to spend 4-6 hours a week outside of class on homework assignments, as is typical for college work. Our target student is someone of traditional college age who has a "Sunday School knowledge" of the OT but wishes to gain a broader understanding of the purpose of the OT. Of course, anyone may audit the course. It is a "survey" course, not a verse by verse study of the whole OT! Students are expected to purchase the textbook shown on the flyer (available in the foyer) prior to class, and bring their own Bible (Mark will use the ESV).

Class Structure & Required Textbook - At each NWSD course, attention is given to Knowledge, Affection, and Obedience. This means we will not only be learning about God, but we will be seeking to love Him and obey His will for us. Each class meeting will include a study of the scriptures using an interactive lecture and discussion format. Every participant should have a good **print** copy of the Bible in a standard translation.

Cost & Registration - For students who would like to audit the class, the recommended donation is \$30. For those taking the course for **college credit**, the course fee is \$60. Registration is required so we can set up chairs appropriately. The month of December was a brief one. I traveled to see my aged mother in the early part of the month. It was necessary I traveled then before the road become too busy because of Christmas rush. To be frank, most of these women cannot afford to buy up to 1kg of rice at this time in Nigeria. This gesture will go a long way in showing them the love of God. The church wants to make this a yearly exercise. Lord willing, we will invite another set of widows this year.



In 2024, two congregations in Mangu were attacked by the Islamic militants. The church building were completely destroyed and the members fled to other neighboring communities. Since then, most of them are refugees in people homes and public buildings. We decided to visit with them. We bought grains, fertilizers for farming, clothes and mattresses for them. It was touching when we saw where these brethren are putting up. More so during this cold weather in Plateau State.

Below is a picture of the brother from the Southern Nigeria who sponsored most of the items, some of



the church members and the donations we made available to them.

Please, keep them in your prayers that peace will return to that environment.

The congregations in Mazah, Foron Mission and New Foron are doing well. I am glad to mention that the New Foron congregation is getting a preacher who has agreed to work with the small congregation. It is a sacrifice he has made because the congregation is a small one, and can't sustain him financially. I have to support them just like the one in Foron Mission if the preacher

must survive there. I really appreciate the help coming from you. Without you, this mission would not have been possible. May God bless you all in his special way. If not for the regular violent attacks on some villages here in Plateau and the insecurity in the northern Nigeria, these congregations would have grown faster than what we have now. But we still appreciate God for the souls saved in these places. Once again, thank you so much. May God continue to bless you and your families.
