



Dear Beloved brethren,

On behalf of my wife, Sandra, my children, the staff and students of the School of Biblical Studies, Jos, I greet you all in the precious name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We thank God for seeing us through the month of April. We pray that the same grace given to us through the month of April be extended to us in the month of May, 2025. You might have heard of the sad incidence that happened in some local communities around Jos in the month of April. In two different communities within a span of two weeks, the Islamic militant loaded themselves with weapons went and attacked innocent harmless villagers and killed them. In those two places, more than 100 people were murdered in their homes. The attackers were ruthless to kill even 3 year old babies and pregnant women. This has left the environment in the state of mourning for some days now. We are afraid if we will have many people coming for this year's lectureship and graduation. We know God has his way in everything. Continue to pray with us for safety please.

Academics—We appreciate you all for praying for us to have a successful semester. Our Students have completed their exams and now leaving for campaign for Christ evangelism. The Semester was very short because it was loaded with many activities that nearly overwhelmed us. Though there were security threats in the out skirt of Jos as I mentioned earlier, the city of Jos was peaceful throughout the month of April. We know this would not have happened without God causing peace to remain in Jos city. As Affiliate of the University of Jos in awarding degree in Christian Religious Studies, it is required of us that the University sends their officials to matriculate the year one students into their program of study. In this case, three officials were sent during the month of April: The Head of Department of Religions and Philosophy, a representative of the Vice Chancellor and a representative of the Registrar. Our Medical Clinic - Our Medical Clinic kicked started its clinical service operations on the 11th of April, 2025. It was marked by free medical services to people who came for the ribbon cutting ceremony. The clinic being a primary health facility offers services like malaria tests and treatment, typhoid fever diagnosis and treatment, child delivery and maternity, vaccination of babies against the killer diseases, diagnosis of hepatitis and treatment, handling of emergency cases, medical counseling, etc. We have bought some medications and necessary tools for the clinic. One important equipment that is not in the clinic is the scanning machine. Since we are going to provide maternity services, there is need to have scanning machine for the pregnant women. But without it, the clinic is providing other services it is capable of providing. At least, our students will not have to be carried outside at night when they fall sick. This also will help us to provide holistic services to the host community. Below are pictures of activities during the grand opening ceremony. We have four nurses, four ward maids, one lap scientist, two security men, and a visiting doctor. He will come once a week in the interim, except occasion demands more than that.

Evangelism - During the month of April, we conducted 86 studies with 987 prospects. The drop in the number of studies is because of our students involvement in their final exams. However, out of the number of people studies, 7 people obeyed the Gospel, and were baptized for the forgiveness of their sins. We gave out 2,302 tracts and 7 Bible were also given out. Our students and staff are now out for 9 days of intensive door knocking. This time we are going to 4 places outside Plateau, one place within Plateau, and the rest of the students will cover the city area of Jos, making a total of 6 places.

Student Farm - We have had our first rain of the year in the month of April after more than 6 months of dry season without any rain. Agricultural work across the State of Plateau will begin. Already, our garden beds are greenish with green beans, peas, tomatoes, spinach, etc. With the rising insecurity in the Northern Nigeria, people prefer to farm only in the areas close to the house to avoid kidnapping and attacks. This automatically creates scarcity of farm land. We teach our students how they can use small space to cultivate their vegetables to subsidize family needs. We also teach our student how to raise chicken, fish, and rabbits. This is our newly made rabbit cage that has its feeder and drinker all within each cage.
