October 7, 2025 REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF September, 2025 (TOM EKPOT JR.)

Dear Beloved brethren,

On behalf of my wife, I bring you warm greetings from the Northern Nigeria in the precious name of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are deeply grateful for your continued partnership, prayers, and financial support that have made our effort to reach different areas possible. We appreciate God for seeing us through the month of September, 2025. Secondary and Primary Schools have resumed from their long break, and children have gone back to school. We experienced a lot of rainfall during the month of September. We thank God for that. But the rainy season is going out. Some crops will be due for harvest this month. We are in the business of soul harvest all the seasons.

This report provides an update on the progress of our activities, challenges faced, and the impact being made among the people of Northern Nigeria. The Northern Nigeria remains one of the most challenging mission fields in Africa. The region is characterized by religious tension, insecurity, poverty, and limited access to education and healthcare. Despite these challenges, the Gospel continues to advance through strategic evangelism and discipleship efforts. The clinic at the School of Biblical Studies is creating more opportunities for us to reach more people with the Gospel.

During the month of September, which marked the end of the third quarter, we visited several unreached communities in Ray-

field and Foron areas. Through door knocking and correspondence course (in places we are not allowed to sit with some prospect), and distribution of Christian literature, many hearts were touched. We will continue to sow the seed of the kingdom as long as God gives us opportunity. The young congregations at Ray Field and Foron areas are moving on. I am glad that the two congregations at Foron now have preachers who are willing to reside in the community with the brethren. At the Rayfield Congregation, we are conducting intensive door knocking evangelism. We are having many neighbors who develop interest in worshipping with us. They are meeting in a temporal accommodation. We look forward to having a meeting place when God will make the provision.

Discipleship and Leadership Training at the School of Biblical Studies

At the School of Biblical Studies, every September gives us opportunity to bring preachers, Bible teachers and leaders of different congregation across the country to a two day workshop. This year's workshop was on Discipleship and Church Impact in the Community. Several participants attended this year's program. The workshop focused on how to develop disciples for Christ in the church and how the church can impact the communities positively for people to see the beauty of Jesus. Below is the picture of attendees during one of the sessions.

Our weekend evangelism outing continues. When we went on break in May, we did not suspend this activity as where ever our students and staff went, they kept preaching the gospel. During the month of September, we were able to conduct 329 studies with 1,486 prospects. Out of these figures, 7 people obeyed the Gospel and were baptized into Christ for the forgiveness of their sins.

Despite the encouraging progress, we continue to face significant challenges. These include: Insecurity and restricted access to certain mission fields and limited material resources in the local languages for expanding our work. We continue to trust God for safety, wisdom, and provision.

We sincerely thank you, our brothers and sisters, for your faithful prayers, financial giving, and encouragement. Your support continues to bring hope and transformation to lives across Northern Nigeria. Together, we are witnessing God's Kingdom advancing in difficult places.

The mission in Northern Nigeria is both challenging and rewarding. God's faithfulness is evident as lives are being transformed daily through the power of the Gospel. We covet your continued prayers for protection, wisdom, and provision as we press forward in His service. We pray that God will open to us wider door to reach more people with the Gospel.

May the Lord continue to bless you all abundantly as you partner with us in His harvest.
