Mohsen's Message July, August, September 2025

Dear Ones and Family in Christ,

Let us never forget that, because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. Lamentations 3:22-23 They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.

In July, Rose and I drove to Pennsylvania to visit family and attend the family reunion, after worshipping with the church in Clarion, Pa. This year 27 were present at the family reunion which we always look forward to. There is always good food and fellowship. I was able to share God's word with some of her family members. We went to Newcastle, Pa to visit Rose's brother Bill who is not doing well. We brought him couple big boxes of food. We had a nice visit with him.

In August Tia, a former Mormon, was searching for the truth. I had the chance to study with her in a couple of occasions right after Bible classes. She finally came forward during the invitation and was immersed into Christ for the remission of her sins! Glory to God!

On August the 11th five of us, Françoise Besse from Paris, Rose & I, and Larry & Margaret Steiner were on our way to Canada to participate at the annual retreat of the French congregations. Driving from Newark, DE to Saint Ambroise takes 14.5 hours! We drove 8 hours and stopped for the night. Five of us in my small Honda! I admit it was tight, Lord willing, next year we will rent a van which will be more comfortable. Last year there were 27 there but this year there were 37. I had the opportunity to speak to Benoit, who was invited by a brother. His religious background was Catholic, then Baptist and finally Assembly of God. After studying with Jean Grenier and myself he better understood the scripture and decided to be baptized and put on Christ. We all rejoice that another soul was added to the Lord's kingdom in French, Canada. As I've have been doing for the past five years, I am on the program and have the pleasure of cooking for them. The theme for this year was based on Colossians 3:14 which says, "But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection."

Upon our return to from Canada, we decided to go visit Rose's other brother Jim who lives in Charleston, West Virginia with their sister Mary. Jim gets dialysis 3 times a week. He is 6 feet 4 inches tall and is down to 100 pounds. We had a nice visit with both. Afterwards I drove down to Savannah, Georgia to visit with my sister and brother-in-law James. While driving down I hit a piece of metal on the road and had a flat tire, we were then only 25 miles from my sister's home. We were supposed to arrive at 7PM but we did not make it till 11:45 PM. Early the next day I went to Walmart to have put on a new tire. Then one more problem came up with the car, the battery went dead on me, so I went to Honda garage, and had a new battery installed. Between the truck, new tire and new battery came out to be close to \$500.

While we were there we visited the Ellabell congregation which handles our support, and I preached that Sunday. They had a wonderful fellowship meal for us; it was nice to be with our brothers and sisters. Tuesday morning, we headed back to Newark DE. I was glad that my sister decided to

come along, so she stayed with us for 3 weeks and flew back home.

Once back in Delaware I had a wedding cake to make for Christina and LeBron Parker. We have known her and her family for more than 30 years. Everyone enjoyed the cake. Our daughter Anna decided to go to a Chinese buffet, altogether we were 13. Once we headed toward the buffet I noticed that a family was not from the USA. I asked him "Where you from Sir?" He replied from Ivory Coast, Africa. I replied to him in French, and a big smile came upon his face, and we had a nice conversation. His has been in the air force for the past five years, we exchanged phone numbers and email addresses and wife expressed the desire that she wanted to study God's word. I have sent them a BCC in French.

Here are the list and names of all the contacts that I have made so far in the States:

Josue Hyacinthe, and his friend Etienne Mordant, both
Haitian people that I met on the way back from Canada in a
rest area in New York state. I have sent to them BCC in
French.

Brittany Piper, we met at the post office here in Newark, a Presbyterian, she used to work as a secretary for President Trump. We had a good Bible discussion while waiting our turn at post office.

Janet Gaines, met her at the fruit market. Working as a nurse, she does not go anywhere presently but is wanting to learn more about the Bible, so I sent her a BCC.

Mary Wilson, met at Walmart, a lady in her 60s raised Catholic, does not have much knowledge about the Bible. I also send a BCC in English.

Alan Bradford, a pharmacist I met at the wedding reception; we talked a lot about the word of God, presently Baptist in a small group, he is not very happy about what's going on in some of the large Baptist groups, and we supposed to get together for Bible studies.

Debbie Jehovah witness met at Costco she worked there; we share scriptures but could not give me an answer about some passages of the Bible, we are stay in contact through E-mail.

Lauri Therrien, an older lady also working at Costco. Catholic background, does have much knowledge about the Bible.

Elea Lynx met her at grocery store and her friend Morgan. She knew some of the Bible but mostly goes about feelings when she comes to religion and her friend Morgan is Baptist but does not practice very much. Yet, interested in learning more.

Curtis Hoper Insurance agent I met at Walmart, from a Pentecostal group which observes the Sabbath and also worships on Sunday; we shared the scriptures interested on learning more, so I am sending him BCC and Bible study material.
